



**Town of Parry Sound COVID-19 Vaccine Certificate Protocol
For the Charles W. Stockey Centre for the Performing Arts and Bobby Orr Hall of
Fame
Effective September 22, 2021**

The Town of Parry Sound is committed to ensuring the health and safety of all participants, visitors, and staff at our facilities. This document outlines the process for verifying vaccine certificates for members of the public attending events at the Charles W. Stockey Centre for the Performing Arts and Bobby Orr Hall of Fame.

The public are expected to follow provincial protocols under the [Ontario Reopening Plan](#).

Starting September 22, 2021, Ontarians will need to be fully vaccinated (two doses plus 14 days) and provide their proof of vaccination along with photo ID to access certain public settings and facilities which include concert halls, performing arts theatres, wedding venues and meeting and convention centres.

Starting September 22, 2021

Who is required to show a Vaccine Certificate?

- Ticket holders attending any event at the facility.
- Guests of any organized event, such as celebrations, weddings, meetings, conferences, or workshops alike.

Exemptions:

- Visitors to the Doug & Arva Orr Gift Shop.
- Visitors to the Bobby Orr Hall of Fame.
- Visitors to the West Parry Sound Area Visitor Information Centre.
- Workers, contractors, repair workers, delivery workers, students, volunteers, inspectors, or others who are entering the facility for work purposes and not as patrons or attendees of an event.
- Artists, artist crews, tech crews and performers.
- Children under 12 years of age.
- Patrons accessing the facility to use the washroom only.
- Patrons who provide a written document, completed, and supplied by a physician (designated as "MD") or by a registered nurse in the extended class (designated as "Registered Nurse (Extended Class)", "RN(EC)", "Nurse Practitioner" or "NP") stating that the individual is exempt for a medical reason from being fully vaccinated against COVID-19 and the effective time-period for the medical reason. Patrons with a medical exemption are required to present identification and a written document which:

- Is written on letterhead or has a logo identifying the signing authority
- States that there is a medical reason for the individual's exemption from being fully vaccinated against COVID-19
- Identifies any effective time-period for the medical reason includes the date the patron is seeking access to the business or organization.

Process and Steps for Verification of Vaccine Certificates

- All patrons, attendees or guests attending an event at the Stockey Centre will still be required to complete a COVID screening prior to arriving at the facility or when they arrive at the facility.
- All patrons, attendees or guests attending an event will still be required to wear masks/face coverings in the facility. Masks can only be removed for the consumption of food/beverage, which is done in a controlled setting at a dedicated seat that is physically distanced from other seats.
- Proof of vaccination will be accepted if:
 - The person's name and date of birth on their identification document matches the name and date of birth of their vaccination receipt; and,
 - The vaccine receipt has been issued by the Province of Ontario, an Indigenous Health Provider, or another jurisdiction that shows the holder has been fully vaccinated against COVID-19; and,
 - The vaccine receipt verifies the holder is fully vaccinated; and,
 - The vaccine receipt was issued at least 14 days prior to the date the holder is seeking access to the facility.
- Proof of identity can be established using documentation issued by an institution or public body, provided it includes the name of the holder and date of birth. Examples of identification documents that may be used to confirm the identity of the holder of the vaccine receipt include:
 - Birth certificate
 - Citizenship card
 - Driver's license
 - Government (Ontario or other) issued identification card, including health card
 - Indian Status Card/Indigenous Membership Card
 - Passport
 - Permanent Resident card
- Validation of identification is considered to have been completed/successful when the **name and date of birth of the presenter of the vaccination receipt and the name and date of birth on the identification document match**. If the name and date of birth on documents do not match, the individual will not be allowed to enter the facility.
